



# The Shepherd's Academy Academic Fairs

(continued from page 1.) These Academic Fairs consisted of a Social Studies Fair held on February 15, 2021 and a Science Fair held on March 4, 2021.

SOCIAL STUDIES FAIR. The Social Studies Fair consisted of an Elementary Division, Middle School Division, and High School Division. The categories included Civics and Government, Anthropology, History, Geography, and Economics. The evaluation criteria was rigorous and included a written report, bibliography, and board display. Additionally, Upper Elementary through High Schoolers were required to submit their report in accordance with APAv6 guidelines. The written report must include the integration of Biblical Truths which rationalizes social studies from a distinctively Biblical Worldview.

For the Elementary Division: Noelle Doyle won 1st Place, Japheth Solomon won 2nd Place, Senay Weldeyesus won 3rd Place, and Miriam Weldeyyesus won 4th Place, For the Middle School Division: Aniya Martin won 1st Place, Keziah Ponder won 2nd Place, and Nathan Solomon won 3rd Place. For the High School Division: Michael Penn won 1st Place and Yosias Weldeyesus won 2nd Place. Noelle Doyle also won All Around Best Presentation. Well done scholars!

DCHE was delighted to donate prize money (via Amazon Cards) for the fairs: \$15.00 for 1st Place, \$10.00 for 2nd Place, \$5.00 for 3rd Place, and \$15.00 for Best Research and Best Presentation.

SCIENCE FAIR. The Science Fair consisted of an Elementary Division, Middle School Division, and High School Division. The categories were based on the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair ("ISEF") categories including several Engineering, Mathematics, Physics, Science and STEM topics. The <u>evaluation criteria</u> for this fair was equally thorough and required that participants submit a Science Fair Notebook, Logbook, and Physical Display. Additionally, all participants were required to submit their Science Fair Notebook research components in accordance with MLA guidelines. The written report must include the a Biblical Abstract which rationalizes science from a distinctively Biblical Worldview.

For the Elementary Division: Noelle Doyle won 1st Place, Japheth Solomon won 2nd Place. For the Middle School Division: Aniya Martin won 1st Place and Nathan Solomon won 2nd Place. For the High School Division: Michael Penn won 1st Place. Also, Noelle Doyle won for Best Presentation and Michael Penn won Best Research/Scientific Thought. Well done scholars!

(continued from page 1; Republished from the DCHE Dispatch Vol#5 Issue 10) **Who is Women's History Month for?** Women's History Month is all persons to learn about the history, culture, and contributions of African descendents throughout the diaspora.

What is Women's Month? According to the Library of Congress, Women's History Month is "Women's History Month had its origins as a national celebration in 1981 when Congress passed Pub. L. 97-28 which authorized and requested the President to proclaim the week beginning March 7, 1982 as "Women's History Week." Throughout the next five years, Congress continued to pass joint resolutions designating a week in March as "Women's History Week." (Women's History Month, n.d., para 2)

When is Women's History Month? Women's History Month is celebrated in March corresponding with International Womens Day which occurs on March 8. "In 1987 after being petitioned by the National Women's History Project, Congress passed Pub. L. 100-9 which designated the month of March 1987 as "Women's History Month." (Women's History Month, n.d., para 2)

Where is Women's History Month Celebrated? Women's History Month is primarily celebrated in the United States, the United Kingdom, and Austraila in March. It is also celebrated in Canada in October.

Why do we celebrate Women's History Month? As Christians we celebrate Women's History Month to acknowledge that all persons, including women, are made in the image of God. Genesis 1:27 states: "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them."
