When do we celebrate Christmas?

Christmas is celebrated on December 25 of each calendar year. This date coincides with the beginning of Winter Solstice. Saint Augustine of Hippo, whom many regard as the forerunner of the Protestant Reformation, taught in his 192nd sermon that December 25 was the actual birth day of Jesus Christ. The Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke) and the Gospel of John which details Jesus Christ birth do not provide a specific date. Additionally, the Bible at large does not provide a specific date of Jesus Christ's birth.

So why do we celebrate Jesus' birth on December 25? This date was specifically <u>chosen by the early church</u> to counter and effectively Winter Solstice pagan holiday celebrations. As Christians, we should celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ everyday. However, designation of a yearly holiday to honor His birth is not non-biblical. It can provide us with unique opportunity to share the Gospel and God's Grace.

So What is Christmas?

Christmas, historically referred to as Christ's mass, is a multinational holiday where Catholics and Protestant Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

Where do we celebrate Christmas?

Christians primarily celebrate Christmas at Church and at Home. Church celebrations typically include a special service with a sermon, prayer, candlelight, fellowship, and/or food. Home celebrations typically include prayer, bible studies, decorations, food, fellowship, and/or gifts.

Who currently celebrates Christmas?

Christmas is primarily celebrated by Christians however non-Christians also celebrate in cultural festivities.

Why do we celebrate Christmas?

As Christians we celebrate the birth of Christ, God incarnate (also referred to as theophany). His birth was prophecied about in the Old Testament (Zechariah 9:9, Isaiah 7:14, Jeremiah 23:5, Micah 5:2, Hosea 11:1). His birth was required to allow for His death, burial, and resurrection which ultimately allowed for our redeption. Therefore we celebrate His birth to commemorate the fulfillment of that prophecy attests to the infallabile testament of the Bible which allows for our redemption in Christ.


