


(continued from page 1) your hard work and representation throughout the homeschool community and local community!

Did you know that <u>according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics</u>, STEM disciplines are projected to grow more than 9 million by 2022 (BLS, 2014)? According to the <u>National Science Foundation</u>, approximately 40% of students in the United States are proficient in STEM disciplines (NSF, 2014).

RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

SPINACH & STRAWBERRY SALAD WITH FETA



(Genius Kitchen, n.d., para 1)

INGREDIENTS

7 -10 cups fresh Baby Spinach (washed, dried and stems removed, or use as much as desired) 5 cups sliced fresh strawberries 1/4 cup toasted sliced almonds (candied almonds are good too!) 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese (can use more)

DRESSING

1/2 cup vegetable oil
1/4 cup balsamic vinegar (or use raspberry wine vinegar or white wine vinegar)
1/4-1/3 cup white sugar
1 pinch paprika
1 -2 tablespoon poppy seed

DIRECTIONS

In a large bowl toss the spinach with the strawberries and toasted almonds. In another small bowl whisk together all dressing ingredients, starting with 1/4 cup sugar and adding in more to taste, then pour over the spinach; toss to combine.

Sprinkle the feta over the top of salad.

Serve immediately.
