



The Origins of Black History Month

(continued from page 1) Who is Black History Month for? Black History Month is all persons to learn about the history, culture, and contributions of African descendents throughout the diaspora.

What is Black History Month? Black History Month originated as Negro History Week in 1926 during the 3rd week of February in simultaneous commemoration of Frederick Douglas and Abraham Lincoln's birthdays. The purpose of the Negro History Week was to educate and inform African Americans as well as greater society on the history of African American contributions. This week was later expanded to cover the entire month of February in the United States in 1970 at Kent State University and formally acknowledged by President Ford in 1976.

When is Black History Month? Black History Month is formally acknowledged and celebrated throughout the month of February (February 1-28) and October each year. However, many culturally inclusive History programs will acknowledge and reference Black historical figures and events throughout United States and World History.

Where is Black History Month Celebrated? Black History Month is primarily celebrated in the United States, Canada, United Kingdom, and the Netherlands Republic of Ireland.

Why do we celebrate Black History Month? As Christians we celebrate Black History Month to acknowledge that all persons, including ethnic minorities, are made in the image of God. We also comemmorate the efforts to end of systematic racism and its byproducts (including segregated schooling/housing/retail, antimecegination, and discriminatory voting practices). Racism is a violation of the 2nd commandment, as it reveres one group of people as greater then another.
